

A community survey of Western Ringtail Possums








A SNAPSHOT OF RESULTS March - May 2018

100% HAD RINGTAILS!





The **HIGHEST NUMBER** of possums per survey occurred at Wonnerup and Quindalup 2016-2018.

TO PROTECT OUR RINGTAILS, protect your peppies, keep cats and dogs indoors at night, plant native gardens and drive carefully at night.

A total of 146 hours were spent looking out for possums, across 279 evening surveys
