SOIL TESTING

The Geographe Soil Testing Program is aimed at giving farmers confidence in their nutrient management decisions as well as reduce nutrient loss from their properties.

The program includes soil sampling, whole farm nutrient mapping, tissue testing, plus access to customised agronomic advise, all to assist farmers with improving fertiliser decisions.

Since 2009, over 40% of the Geographe catchment has been soil tested, contributing to an annual reduction of 4.8 tonnes of phosphorus entering Geographe Bay.

Expressions of Interest open mid-year, with soil sampling taking place November-December. Cost to new farmers is \$300 - prices may vary depending on farm size.

RIVER CARE

GeoCatch has been partnering with landholders for over 25 years to help manage waterways and enhance riparian vegetation.

Installing fencing and revegetating waterways has important benefits to farm management and water quality and the environment, including improving soil structure and filtration to retain nutrients on-farm, preventing erosion, providing shelter to livestock, and increasing habitat to support local wildlife.

GRAZING MATCHER

Grazing Matcher is a group-learning program for beef and sheep farmers facilitated by experts in grazing management and animal health.

It supports producers to improve grazing, fodder and feed decisions and meet eight times over 12 months at host farms.

Expressions of Interest are now open for the 2023 program, beginning in April 2023. The program is subsidised with the cost to farmers \$650 per farm enterprise.
